SVDP was initially formed in France, 180 years ago. It is now active in most countries. It was brought to New Zealand 150 years ago. Christchurch was the first centre in New Zealand to have a Vincentian group. Our local conference here in Burnside has a long history of assisting those in need in our community.

What do we do? We help those in need! We do not discriminate between race or religion. We help anyone who asks or is referred to us, mainly, by putting together a food parcel that feeds the family or individual for 2-3 days. Currently, we average 25 calls per month in this area. We also help with other things if needed, such as power card top-ups, budgeting advice and referrals to other community services.

We currently have a great team; however, we have recently lost a few members due to retirements and health, and need to strengthen our membership. If you think you may be able to help us in the following areas then please consider joining us.

With a strong team, many hands make light work. You will only need to allocate 1-2 hours per month. The jobs we would like assistance with are:

- Delivering food parcels to welfare clients
- Assisting the monthly Laura Fergusson Housie Evening
- Computer data base administration
- Helping with keeping our food bank topped up

We meet once a month for a short meeting and spread the load, so that members are not overworked.
